COURSE DESCRIPTION

Medical English for MDs

- is a **16-week**, **48-hour** course held **once a week** on **Monday evenings**.
- is organized by Istanbul Medical Chamber with the support of Istanbul Bilgi University
- aims to develop English communication skills on patient-doctor communication
- aims to develop **reading and writing skills and strategies** through **medical articles**
- aims to develop **listening and presentation skills** for **medical conferences**
- involves a variety of materials from different sources
- requires its participants to actively get involved in the class activities and discussions
- requires its participants to get prepared before the classes and to practice with assignments after the classes
- aims to equip the participants with **self study skills** that will be necessary in their future academic/professional studies.
